• "How do you determine whether an antibiotic was solely for a pulmonary infection? What if it is given to treat multiple infections?"

I think the easiest way is to confirm this with the treating clinicians or microbiologists.

# • "What are your biggest recruitment challenges?"

I think that one of the biggest recruitment challenges we had, certainly at the start of the study, was defining what is classed as difficult to clear secretions, as there can be differences from person to person. We have for sometime now involved the physiotherapists and had a physiotherapist as an API for the study which has certainly helped.
